The California Prison Industry Authority (CALPIA) is hosting the 2014 Employer Forum. CALPIA trains over 8,000 offenders per year in service, manufacturing, and agricultural industries in California's penal institutions. CALPIA is self-supporting and sells over 1,500 different products to tax supported agencies. Our most important product is a skilled worker who does not return to prison.

CALPIA and the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) partner with California Sheriff's Departments in their effort to rehabilitate offenders at the local level. Post-prison realignment, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department has demonstrated its leadership and expertise in the rehabilitation of county level offenders, creating an additional pool of trained workers available for hire.

The Employer Forum will be held at the Los Angeles Trade-Technical College (LATTC) which has a unique 90-year history as a public community college, providing industry-driven career-technical training and education for thousands.
