**All Classes:**

This enterprise involves the shoe manufacturing process, specializing in cutting, stitching, lasting, injection molding, finishing and packing.

**Industrial Supervisor, Prison Industries (Shoe Manufacturing)**

An Industrial Supervisor, Prison Industries (Shoe Manufacturing) plans and schedules production including labor, materials, and equipment; coordinates and/or supervises installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of equipment and/or machinery; makes recommendations to increase production efficiency and product quality; trains, counsels, and supervises inmates or residents in production work, quality control, safety, and personnel development; evaluates their performance and recommends appropriate action; assists in budget preparation and makes recommendations for needed materials, labor, and equipment; supervises preparation of records and reports on production, processing, and inventories; maintains order and supervises the conduct of persons committed to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation; prevents escapes and injury by these persons to themselves or others or to property; maintains security of working areas and work materials; inspects and searches inmates or residents for contraband, such as weapons or illegal drugs; and does other related work.

**Prison Industries Superintendent I (Shoe Manufacturing)**

A Prison Industries Superintendent I (Shoe Manufacturing) supervises or assists in supervising an industrial shoe manufacturing operation; plans and schedules labor, material, and equipment for production; coordinates and/or supervises installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of equipment; makes recommendations to increase production, efficiency, and product quality; assists in the development, preparation for production, and marketing of new products; selects, trains, counsels, and supervises staff and inmates in production work; is responsible for quality control, production control, inventory control, methods analysis, cost control, material research, procurement, safety, and personnel development; evaluates performance of staff and inmates and takes or recommends appropriate action; assists in budget preparation and makes recommendations for needed materials and equipment; supervises preparation of records and reports on production, processing, and inventories; dictates correspondence and prepares reports; maintains order and supervises the conduct of persons committed to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation; prevents escapes and injury by these persons to themselves or others or to property; maintains security of working areas and work materials; inspects premises and searches inmates or wards for contraband, such as weapons or illegal drugs.

**Prison Industries Superintendent II (Shoe Manufacturing)**

A Prison Industries Superintendent II (Shoe Manufacturing) is responsible for supervising an industrial shoe manufacturing operation; plans and schedules labor, material, and equipment for production; coordinates and/or supervises installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of equipment; makes recommendations to increase production, efficiency, and product quality; assists in development, preparation for production, and marketing of new products; selects, trains, counsels, and supervises staff and inmates in production work; is responsible for quality control, production control, inventory control, methods analysis, cost control, material research, procurement, safety, and personnel development; evaluates performance of staff and inmates and takes or recommends appropriate action; assists in budget preparation and makes recommendations for needed materials and equipment; supervises preparation of records and reports on production, processing, and inventories; dictates correspondence and prepares reports; maintains order and supervises the conduct of persons committed to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation; prevents escapes and injury by these persons to themselves or others or to property; maintains security of working areas and work materials; and inspects premises and searches inmates or wards for contraband, such as weapons or illegal drugs.

<b>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</b>	<p><b><u>Industrial Supervisor, Prison Industries (Shoe Manufacturing)</u></b>  Two years of production experience in a shoe manufacturing enterprise or trade. (Education, such as trade school, vocational education, or major in the trade at the community college, college, or university level may be substituted for the required experience on the basis that two years of education is equal to one year of the required work experience. Such education must include two years of course work in the specified industrial operation.)</p> <p><b><u>Promotional Candidate:</u></b> Promotional candidates, including employees on training-and-development assignments, who are within six months of meeting the “Minimum Qualifications” for the specified promotional class, will be admitted to the examination, but first must complete the required experience before they can be eligible for appointment.</p> <p><b><u>Prison Industries Superintendent I (Shoe Manufacturing)</u></b>  <b>Either I</b>  One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of an Industrial Supervisor, Prison Industries (Shoe Manufacturing).  <b>Or II</b>  Three years of production experience in a shoe manufacturing processing enterprise or trade, at least one year of which shall have been in a supervising capacity.</p> <p><b><u>Prison Industries Superintendent II (Shoe Manufacturing)</u></b>  <b>Either I</b>  One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of Prison Industries Superintendent I (Shoe Manufacturing).  <b>Or II</b>  Two years of experience in the California state service performing the duties of an Industrial Supervisor, Prison Industries (Shoe Manufacturing).  <b>Or III</b>  Four years of production experience in a shoe manufacturing processing enterprise or trade, at least two years of which shall have been in a supervising capacity.</p>
<b>SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS</b>	Tact, patience, and ability to work with persons confined in a correctional institution.
<b>SPECIAL PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS</b>	Persons appointed to positions in this class must be reasonably expected to have and maintain sufficient strength, agility, and endurance to perform during stressful (physical, mental, and emotional) situations encountered on the job without compromising their health and well-being or that of their fellow employees or that of inmates. Assignments during tour of duty may include sole responsibility for the supervision of inmates and/or the protection of personal and real property.

<b>EXAMINATION INFORMATION</b>	<p>This examination will consist of a qualifications appraisal interview. <b>VETERANS' PREFERENCE/CAREER CREDITS</b>	<p><b>Veterans Preference:</b> Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows: <b>1.</b> Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. <b>EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE</b>	If conditions warrant, this examination may utilize an evaluation of each candidate's experience and education compared to the standards developed from the class specification. For this reason, it is especially important that each candidate take special care in accurately and completely filling out his or her application. List all experience relevant to the "Requirements for Admittance to the Examination." Supplementary information will be accepted, but read the "Requirements for Admittance to the Examination" and the "Scope" carefully to see what kind of information will be useful to the staff doing the evaluation.

**GENERAL INFORMATION**

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the CALPIA at (916) 358-2696 three weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received a progress notice.

If a candidate's notice of oral interview or performance test fails to reach him/her prior to the day of the interview, due to a verified postal error, he/she will be rescheduled upon written request.

Applications are available at the State Personnel Board, local offices of the Employment Development Department, CALPIA, and at [www.pia.ca.gov](http://www.pia.ca.gov).

If you meet the requirements stated on the reverse, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination described in this bulletin will be compared with the performance of the others who take this test, and all candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

**The California Prison Industry Authority** reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

**Examination Locations:** When a written test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. Ordinarily, oral interviews are scheduled at Folsom headquarters and correctional institutions throughout the State. However, locations of interviews may be limited or extended as conditions warrant.

**Eligible Lists:** Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) Subdivisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in from one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin and under certain circumstances may be extended beyond that time.

**Veterans' Preference Credits:** California Law allows granting of Veterans' Preference Credits in Open examinations and Open Non-Promotional exams. Credit in open entrance examinations is granted as follows: 10 points for veterans, widows and widowers of veterans and spouses of 100%-disabled veterans; and 15 points for disabled veterans. Credit in Open Non-promotional examinations is granted as follows: 10 points for veterans; and 15 points for disabled veterans. Directions for applying for Veterans' Preference Credits are on the Veterans' Preference application (Form 10093), which is available from the State Personnel Board Office, the Department of Veterans Affairs, P. O. Box 942895, Sacramento, CA 94295-0001, and by contacting CALPIA.

**High School Equivalence:** Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Education Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work, 3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the candidate is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.
