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### 1 SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA 2 WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 28, 2015 3 ---000---4 CHAIR BEARD: I'm going to call this meeting of the Prison Industry Authority to order at 5 6 11:03 a.m.; and this meeting, unlike most of our meetings, is being held in five different locations. They're all publicly noticed locations. And we are 8 going to begin by asking the Board secretary to call 9 the roll. 10 11 MS. GUARE: Good morning. Please acknowledge your presence by saying here when I call 12 13 your name. 14 Chair Beard. 15 CHAIR BEARD: Here. 16 MS. GUARE: Vice Chair Singh. 17 MEMBER SINGH: Here. 18 MS. GUARE: Member Alegria. 19 MEMBER ALEGRIA: Here. 20 MS. GUARE: Member Almanza. 21 Member Davidson. 22 MEMBER DAVIDSON: Here. 23 MS. GUARE: Member Kelly. 24 MEMBER KELLY: Here. 25 MS. GUARE: Member Masteller.

1 MEMBER MASTELLAR: Here. 2 MS. GUARE: Member Saito. 3 Member Steeb. 4 MEMBER STEEB: Here. 5 MS. GUARE: Member Trujillo. 6 MEMBER TRUJILLO: Good morning. I'm here. 7 MS. GUARE: Member Woodford. Chair Beard, we have a quorum. 8 9 CHAIR BEARD: Thank you. Let the record show that we have a quorum. 10 I want to thank everybody for being here 11 today. Hopefully, this meeting won't be too long, 12 13 but thank you for your time. Since we do have five different locations, 14 15 I'll identify myself. I am Jeff Beard, the Secretary of the Department of Corrections, and I am 16 the Chair of the Board. 17 18 This meeting today is being held so that we 19 can approve the California Prison Industry Authority's report to the Legislature. And I 20 21 believe there are two other additional action items 22 on there as well. 23 We do not have any members of the public present here at this location. Are there any public 24 members at any of the other locations on this call? 25

14	would ask any Board Members that would have any

16	Anybody here in this room?

18	Okay. Hearing none, we will move along, and I
19	would ask the General Manager to give his
20	comments.
21	MR. PATTILLO: Good morning, Mr. Chairman
22	and Members. My name is Charles Pattillo. I'm the
23	Executive Officer of the Prison Industry Board and
24	the General Manager of the California Prison
25	Industry Authority. Thanks for meeting via telecom.

We have the four additional locations that we're running at today as we spoke: Long Beach, San Francisco, Hayward, and Encino. Member Alegria is at Long Beach. Member Singh is at San Francisco. We don't have a member at Hayward, although we had noticed it, so Michele Kane is there at the Workforce Investment Board where she is meeting later today. And Member Masteller is in Encino.

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Although we've flown a lot of people out in the field, it's not costing any additional because these folks are -- we've also timed it so we are also doing business at that location. So it works out for us.

Question was: Why do we hold a meeting so quick right after the one we held? There are two reasons. One, we want to wait on our Leg report until the Governor's budget comes out. This year was a good demonstration because, thanks to the Secretary and the Director of Rehabilitative Programs, Millicent Tidwell, we were appropriated via CDCR \$2.6 million for Career Technical Education programs, specifically the ones we've been running in the apprenticeship arena and, also, our technology programs. This will be added extra money specifically to CDCR to contract back with us.

Mr. Chair and Ms. Tidwell, who is not here, thank you very much. It is in the Governor's budget. During the spring we will be communicating with you on what the status is. One of the big pieces of that is 75 percent of that money must be used for female programs. So that's good for all of us. The other one is to include all the December actions. That's why we waited a little bit.

(Member Butler enters.)

MR. PATTILLO: I also want to thank the appointments to the PIA Committee on Executive Recruiting, Retention and Evaluation of Compensation. That would be Members Alegria, Masteller, Singh, Steeb and Trujillo. Randy Fisher who is sitting behind me - Randy raise your hand - is PIA's Chief Administrative Officer. He's taking the lead on developing this with the committee. This is one of the ones we can actually meet on the phone according to protocol, so it will be a lot of electronic, I assume.

Also, at the next Board meeting we are temporarily, or excuse me, tentatively scheduling, we just cleared the Secretary's calendar this morning, for June 25th at 10:00 a.m., here, or it may be in our new showroom. Believe it or not, we

finally got a showroom again after five years. It's down at 19th and Q, I believe is where it's at. It should be done by June. At that meeting we anticipate output from the executive committee, the annual plan budget and then also a discussion about pushing data; all the action items that you have in the Board binder, we are looking for a way to get those out publicly for comment sooner than ten days. A lot of the public isn't getting it that quick.

It saves us a lot of time in responding. In the ten days when we send the agenda out for the meeting, we spend more time on the phone explaining to folks what's going through. I'd rather figure out a way to give them the data up front, with the exception, of course, of drafts that we can't release out, when it's like a Leg report or budget or something like that. At least action items, describe what is there. We will be working on that.

Also, upcoming events. Employer Forum in Alameda County on March 20th. That will be our third Employers Forum. The last two have had over 220 employers come out to talk about hiring exoffenders. Very positive. The one in the Bay Area should be probably the top one we've done. We've got a lot of folks already coming.

The other item is the sheriffs tour April 18th, where we have sheriffs' staff come out. Some of the sheriffs come out and tour the Folsom location. I'll notice that for you all. In the last part I anticipate that -- I would ask you over the next year if you could take some time, whatever institution you want to go out, take an institution. Let's go out there and go tour it. I have access to the Secretary's calendar, so I know where he's at. So if he's at one of my institutions, I can go out there and show him PIA. He's seen just about everything we've got right now. And he's been at every prison right now.

Correct? Right on.

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He did it in a shorter time than I ever did it. That's saying something. I know what his travel schedule is like. But if you all can come out and see what we're doing, especially in the female and the CTE programs.

The other issue is this year all Board Members, some of you've already done it. Mr. Butler, Chair Beard. Bill, I believe you've already done it. That is ethics training that is online. It's got to be completed by end of the year, two-hour online training. Very good. It answers a

lot of questions. Very specific to Board
information, like transparency on what we're doing.
That's where a lot of these ideas are coming out to
increase transparency. You'll need to sign on for
about two hours.

It doesn't have to be all at once, Mr. Kelly.

MEMBER KELLY: I have to do it twice. It's okay.

MR. PATTILLO: If you've already done it somewhere, you don't have to redo it. If it meets the requirement, we can talk about it.

Last part, I really just want to say thank you to Phyllis for putting this together, five locations at once. Also, Lisa Roediger is in the back, and you will probably talk to Lisa more on the main line, on the phone when you call in. Phyllis is doing a lot of behind the scenes Board stuff and setting up whatever needs to be set up.

With that, we will move into our very first item, if there's no questions for me.

Our very first item is to consider approval of the PIA report to the Legislature for Fiscal Year 2013-14. This is a requirement under Penal Code 2808(k) that we report on the financial activity of each enterprise, the plans of the Board regarding

significant changes of existing operations, the plans of the Board regarding development of new enterprises, a breakdown by institutions of the number of prisoners at each institution working in enterprises under the jurisdiction of the Authority, and number that indicates the number of prisons which are not working full-time.

We also include in there the financial audit that was completed last year. So it is a full service package. We post that on line. It's also distributed to the Legislature, as required, and the Governor's office. Five years ago this Board was given the option of not doing the report by the Department of Finance as a way to save paper. We chose otherwise, saying that it's in our best interest to report out everything we do.

If there is anything you see in there that needs to be changed, expanded on, please let us know. The Secretary talked to me this morning again about our plans to move ahead with the third party, being the Attorney General, on a study on recidivism and wanted to assure that, even though we're using the Attorney General, we're working very closely with CDCR research to make sure that it's consistent with the methodology that CDCR reports all programs.

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So it's an alternative communication tool for
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    us, too. That is a big thing. If you ever need to

17	MR. PATTILLO: Item B is a rehearing of an
18	item we did for partial, minor changes. Jeff Sly,
19	our General Counsel, is going to present that item.
20	MR. SLY: I am Jeff Sly, General Counsel
21	for the Prison Industry Authority. We are back with
22	personnel regs this morning.
23	These regulations were previously approved by
24	the Board last June. We submitted them to the
25	Office of Administrative Law. Essentially, we

started out with -- first, let me say that Action

Item B, the first part of that kind of lays out what

it is we're talking about today. A little

explanation about why.

On Exhibit B1, that's the actual, textual language of the regulations; and the underlining and crossouts show what changes that we're proposing and seeking approval of today. And then Exhibit B2 is a supplement to our initial statement of reasons that really gives the background and explanation of why those changes were requested by the Office of Administrative Law.

Having said that, we submitted 22 personnel regulations to the Office of Administrative Law. They have approved 14 of them. They asked us to make some changes to six of them. Those six are what's outlined in Exhibit B1.

As a result of conversations with them, we have deleted three of them that we initially proposed last June. The reasons for two of them was, after discussing with them, they fell under the internal management exemption from the Administrative Procedures Act. They suggested to us we didn't need regulations, that we can do this through a policy which would be easier to change as

the needs arise. Unless anybody has any specific questions about 2 the changes that are proposed that you have had a 3 chance to look at, I will rest my comments for the 4 5 moment. 6 CHAIR BEARD: Any questions or comments? 7 MR. SLY: Hearing none, I would ask the Board to approve these changes so we can move 8 forward with resubmitting these back to OAL and try 9 to finalize this. 10 11 CHAIR BEARD: Do I hear a motion to 12 approve? 13 MEMBER MASTELLER: So moved. 14 CHAIR BEARD: Second? 15 MEMBER ALEGRIA: I will second that. 16 is Member Alegria. 17 CHAIR BEARD: Can we call the roll again? 18 MS. 18	identified division directors of the CDCR, but still
19	be less than the salary of the previous CALPIA GM.
20	MEMBER TRUJILLO: Mr. Chairman, I would
21	move for adoption.

CHAIR BEARD: I don't believe we have any members. We don't have any here. I don't hear that any showed up. There is somebody. He works for me. So he has no comments. Do you?

MR. RIVAS: No. You're right.

MR. PATTILLO: For the record, we can identify Albert Rivas who is the Deputy Chief for External Communications Division.

And I will read this public comment section. This portion of the meeting is reserved for public comment on items not on the agenda. Under the Bagley-Keene Act, the Board cannot act on items raised during public comment, but may respond briefly to statements made or questions posed, request clarification and refer the item to appropriate staff.

Chair Beard has already asked if there are any comments, anybody to address the Board. At this point there is not.

MEMBER BUTLER: May I ask a point of privilege? I know I'm not a member of the public, but I do have one comment I would like to share as

far as the efforts of the Department.

Would that be all right, Mr. Chair?

CHAIR BEARD: Please.

MEMBER BUTLER: As Deputy Director of Procurement for the State, we oversee the State's small business and disabled veterans business enterprise contracting program. And as you may or may not know, we have a goal in law to achieve 25 percent small business contracting and 3 percent DVBE contracting.

As it turns out, Corrections is far and away the largest single buyer of all the things we contract. And, traditionally, as Corrections goes, so goes the State. In this most recent reporting period, at least three-fourths of the state achieved over 25 percent, actually 28 percent in small business contracting and over 3 percent disabled veterans business contracting. Actually, for the fourth year in a row we beat the DVBE goal. And an integral part of that was the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation who achieved well over 30 percent small business contracting and exceeded the DVBE goal as well.

We don't often thank our peers often enough. So it's important for me to be on the public record

today recognizing the outstanding work done by this 1 Department. We held our annual recognitions 2 ceremony just last week and several of the divisions 3 of the Department of Corrections were recognized for 4 their excellent work. I just want to echo our gratitude and 6 7 accommodation for the efforts of all the many people that went in to making that happen. Thank you. 8 9 CHAIR BEARD: I certainly appreciate the comments, and I know all my people that did all the 10 hard work to achieve that appreciate that as well. 11 So, thank you. 12 13 Hearing no other comments, do I have a motion 14 to adjourn. MEMBER TRUJILLO: I have one comment, 15 Mr. Chair. 16 17 MEMBER SINGH: I second that. 18 MEMBER TRUJILLO: I have a comment, too, 19 This is Board Member Trujillo. I just want to say that as a 15-year member of 20 this Board, I just want to compliment Mr. Pattillo 21 on the outstanding job he's done. I've seen several 2.2 in that position and the compensation that you are 23 24 now going to receive is well deserved and should

have happened a long time ago to bring you up to the

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    level where you should be.
